## "Czech Republic and Poland: Advocates of the EU Enlargement?"

Purpose of the seminar:

This expert seminar is organized within the framework of a joint project between DemosEuropa -Centre for European Strategy in Warsaw and EUROPEUM Institute for European Policy in Prague and financed by the Czech - Polish Forum. The main aim of the roundtable will be to discuss the current challenges, pitfalls but also opportunities facing the enlargement process from different regional and country perspectives. In particular, the seminar should reflect on the possible role of Poland and the Czech Republic as countries strongly supporting further enlargement. It should also deliver tangible recommendations as to what these two countries could do to enhance the dynamics of the enlargement process, with particular emphasis on the upcoming Polish EU presidency in the second half of 2011.
